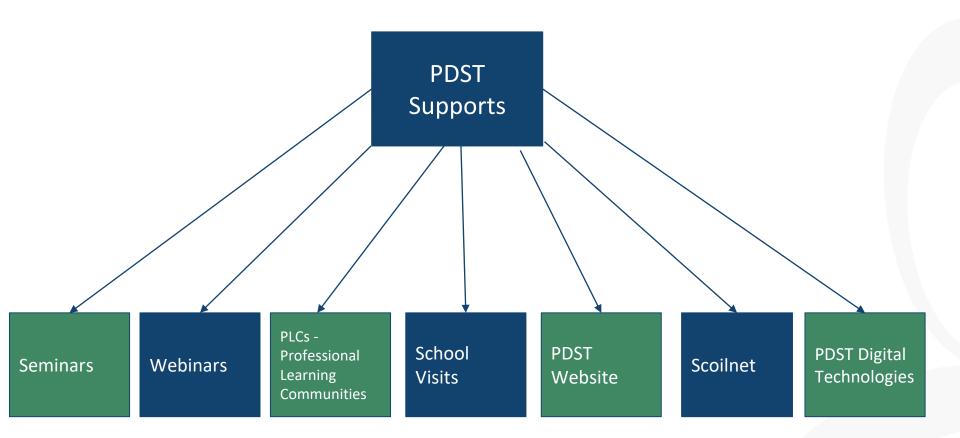





Developing in learners the skills of analysing and interpreting data is an important objective of Politics and Society. Padlet - share resources, data and evidence based on the essential question


