The Story of St. Valentine

The Roman Emperor Claudius II was fighting in many wars. He wanted a strong army, but many of his men did not want to be soldiers. Claudius thought the men wanted to stay at home to be with their wives and family instead of fighting in wars.

Claudius thought long and hard. He came up with a terrible solution to his problem. He decided to cancel all marriages!

"From here on in no one in all of Rome can get married." he said.

He thought that if the men couldn't get married, the men might want to be soldiers.

At this time, there was a priest by the name of Valentine and he believed that people needed to get married. So he decided to secretly and illegally marry couples anyway! He was not scared of Claudius. He carried out the weddings in secret places, so the Roman soldiers would not find out. But they did find out and when they did, Valentine was arrested and brought before the Emperor.

The Emperor thought Valentine was a well spoken and clever, young man, and he wanted him to stop being a priest and to become a loyal Roman. Valentine would not do this so he was sent to prison until he could be executed. While he was in prison, he sent out letters to his friends and asked to be prayed for by writing "Remember your Valentine."

Valentine was put to death by the Romans on the 14th or the 24th of February in the year 269 or 270. That is why some people celebrate Valentine's Day on February 14th.


