
The final chapter in a novel usually provides a **resolution**, when the story is brought to an end, where unanswered questions are answered and 'loose ends' are tied up.

During the novel Danny has been surprised by the behaviour of his best friend Luke towards him. What do we learn about Luke that explains his behaviour?

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
Danny has had a poor relationship with his mother during the novel. How is this resolved?
