- Describe the artists use of paint to capture light and shade, textures, colour.

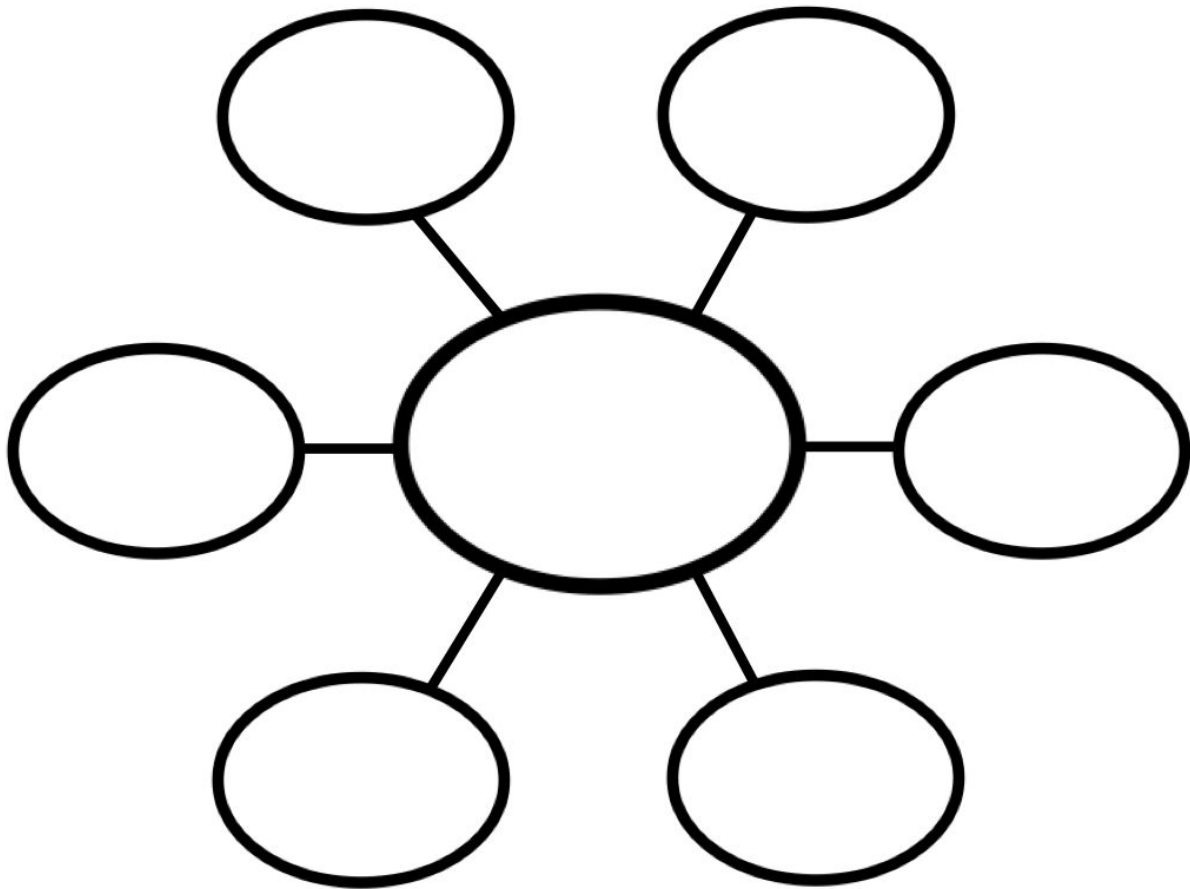
- Margaret Allen made decisions about the furniture, background, and objects in this painting.
- If you made an artwork of your family, what would you include? Pets? Objects? What would you put in the background?





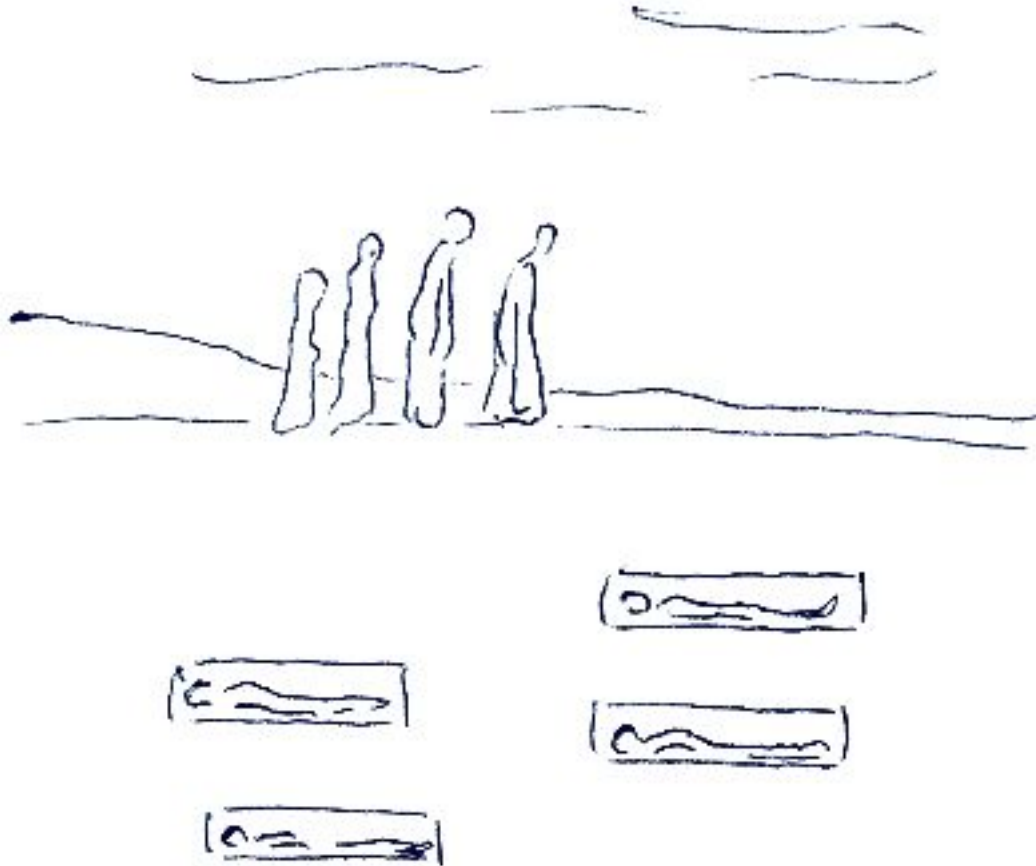
Pádraic Reaney, *Departure*, 1995, Oil on Board, 30 x 21in (76.5 x 53.34cm)

- Colour in the drawing in the colours you would use if you had made this piece of art.



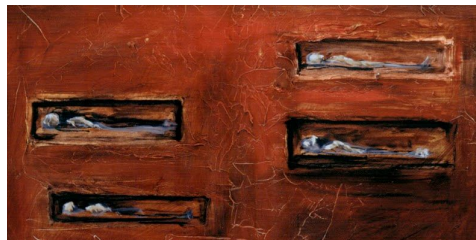
- Has he applied the paint thick or thin? How can you tell?
