- Free pre-school education scheme for children from 3 years of age.
- Interactive, stimulating learning environment

Day Care	<ul> <li>Operate childminding service with integrated education &amp; socialisation development.</li> <li>Provide eating, sleeping, changing, washing &amp; playing facilities</li> <li>Community based or primary run</li> <li>Cater for children up to 5 years old</li> <li>Run by qualified persons, with a certain ratio of careers to children to ensure adequate care &amp; attention</li> </ul>
Playschools & Play groups	<ul> <li>Provide pre-school programme that involves learning-based play and learning by doing to prepare children for the move to primary school</li> <li>Operate for 3-4 hours daily</li> <li>Community based or privately run.</li> <li>Cater for children 3-5 years old</li> <li>Run by qualified persons, with a certain ratio of careers to children to ensure adequate care &amp; attention</li> </ul>
Montessori	<ul> <li>Operates a childminding service that enables children to learn at their own pace through play. They can choose activities they participate in from many possibilities.</li> <li>Self-motivation, independence &amp; creativity encouraged.</li> <li>Cater for children up to 5 years</li> <li>Generally privately run by trained Montessori teachers, with a certain ratio of careers to children to ensure adequate care &amp; attention</li> </ul>
Naionrai	<ul> <li>Provide pre school programme through the Irish language that involves learning through play.</li> <li>They can choose activities they participate in from many possibilites.</li> <li>Operates for 3 to 4 ours daily</li> <li>Used as preparation for children to attend a primary Gaelscoil.</li> <li>Caters for children aged 3-5 years.</li> <li>Run by qualified people who are Irish speakers, with a certain ratio of careers to children to ensure adequate care &amp; attention</li> </ul>



# Benefits of Pre-school Education

- Develops a child's social skills i.e. talking, sharing, listening, mixing with adults and children.
- Child develops confidence i.e. gain independence from parents and forms relationships outside the home.
- Enhances child's intellectual development through the provision of stimulating learning environment
- Child enhances their physical development i.e. hand eye coordination through games.

# <u>Initiatives to support equality of opportunity to pre-primary school.</u>

Early Childhood Care and Education Scheme	<ul> <li>Free Early Childhood Care and Education for children of preschool age to enable them to be ready for formal learning &amp; social environment at primary school</li> <li>Eligible for scheme when they reach 3 &amp; until they transfer to primary school.</li> <li>Must not be older than 5 ½ years by the end of the pre-school year.</li> <li>Children services taking part in the ECCE scheme must provide a pre-school educational programme that follows Siolta, the national framework for early years care &amp; education</li> </ul>
Early Start Pre-School Programme	<ul> <li>1 year pre-primary school intervention scheme in selected primary schools in disadvantaged areas.</li> <li>Objective is to enhance4 the overall development of children between 3 and 4 who are at risk not reaching their potential within the education system.</li> <li>Curriculum focuses on language, cognition &amp; social and personal development to provide a good foundation for future educational achievement.</li> <li>Run by qualified primary school teachers &amp; childcare workers.</li> <li>After completing the early start pre-school programme, children proceed to Junior Infants.</li> </ul>
