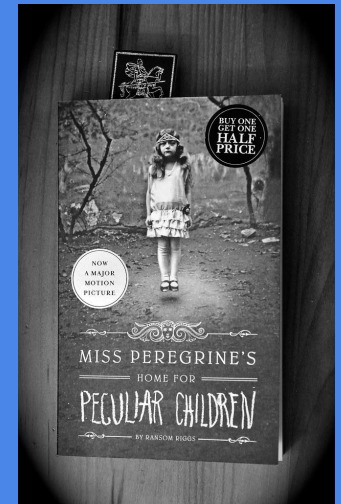

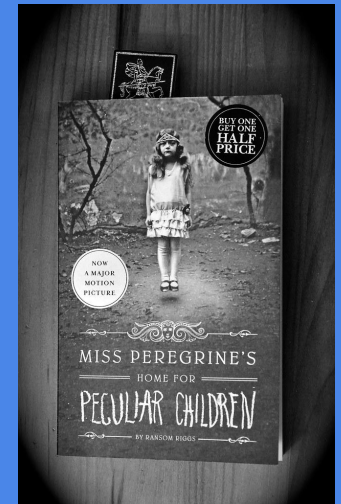

## Wonder:

### Lower Order:

1. Who is the main character of the book?
2. What is the main character's name?
3. What is the main character's physical appearance?
4. What is the main character's condition?
5. What school does the main character attend?
6. What is the name of the main character's mother?
7. What is the name of the main character's sister?
8. What is the name of the main character's best friend?
9. What is the name of the main character's teacher?
10. How does the main character feel about starting school?

### Prediction:

1. Based on the information presented in the first 65 pages, what do you think will be the main challenge August will face in school?
2. Based on what you have read so far, what do you think August's relationships with his peers will be like?

### Cause and Effect:

1. What causes August to be homeschooled and what effect does it have on his social life?
2. Why does August's mother decide to send him to school and what are the results of this decision?

### Sequencing:

1. Can you describe the sequence of events that lead to August's decision to attend school?
2. In what order do August's parents and sister react to his decision to attend school?

*Answer: August's mother starts to feel guilty about him being homeschooled and not having the chance to socialize with other children.*

*August's mother and father discuss the possibility of him attending school.*

*August's father agrees to let him attend school and they start to look for schools that would accept him.*

*August is accepted into Beecher Prep, a private school.*

*August's mother and father tell him that he will be attending school in the fall.*

*August is excited and nervous about starting school and meeting new people.*

*August's sister Via is not supportive of the idea and expresses her concerns.*

*August's mother tells him that they will make it work and it will be a new adventure for him.*

### Main Idea:

1. What is the main idea that the author is trying to convey in the first 65 pages of Wonder?
2. What is the main theme that is presented in the first 65 pages of the book?

*The main idea that the author is trying to convey in the first 65 pages of Wonder is the story of August, a boy with a facial deformity, who has been homeschooled his entire life. The author is introducing the reader to August's life, his thoughts, and emotions, and how he feels about the prospect of going to school for the first time. The main idea is about August's journey to acceptance, self-confidence and belonging. The author is showing the reader the challenges that August faces and how he wants to be seen as an ordinary kid, and how he wants to fit in. The author is highlighting the theme of acceptance, kindness, and empathy.*

### **Characters:**

1. How does August feel about his relationship with his sister Via?
2. What is the nature of August's relationship with his parents?

### **Inferring:**

1. From the information provided in the first 65 pages, what can you infer about August's self-esteem?
2. Based on August's interactions with his family, what can you infer about their feelings towards him?

### **Metaphor:**

*August's face is described as a "mosaic" of "broken pieces" that do not fit together, this metaphor is used to describe how people see him and how different he looks from others. August's experience of going to school for the first time is compared to a "leap into the unknown", this metaphor is used to express the uncertainty and the fear of the unknown that he feels about this new experience.*
