#### **CONDUCT YOUR RESEARCH**

Research the area:

- Is there a local librarian or historical society you could contact for help?
- Each student could pitch a location or person of historical significance that deserves to be on the tour.
- Research your local area online- Historic Environmental Viewer (<u>click</u> <u>here</u>); Maritime wrecks (<u>click here</u>);.

Research walking tours:

- Talk about a tour you went on before and what made it memorable.
- Research walking tours and brochures online to see what is included.
- How will your tour stand out? Personal stories? QR codes linking to

photos of the past/videos/primary sources?

#### **DESIGN YOUR TOUR**

- Will your tour be based on location or on theme or on dates?
- Decide how many points you will have on your tour.
- You could use a graphic organiser to rank them in order of importance.
- Sketch a map of the area or use Google Earth.
  Label the locations you have chosen and map the route you will take.
- How will you present your tour?
  - Create brochure online or by hand? Google maps tour? Podcast?
  - Create a text/ script for each location.
- Where could people go for more information?

#### **CRAFT OF STORYTELLING**

- Who is your audience? Will they be interested in the topics you have included on your tour? Are there any intriguing stories that will engage your audience?
- Does the narrative of your tour flow? Remember the route of your tour may not run in chronological order Will this make sense to your audience?
- Think about body language, tone of voice, eye contact, expression, pausing for dramatic effect.
- Practice delivering your tour!

#### **STEP 1**

To get started with Google Earth go to earth.google.com

#### STEP 2

Click on the Projects icon in the left-hand navigation.

#### STEP 3

Select the 'Create' button to create a new project. You may be prompted to sign in with your Google account, if you are not already signed in. If you don't have a Google account, you can save and download your project as a KML file.

#### **STEP 4**

Click on the 'New feature' button.

#### STEP 5

You can choose to 'Add placemark', 'Draw line or shape' or create a 'Fullscreen slide'. Clicking on 'Add placemark' will allow you to place a marker on the globe. Alternatively, you can use search to add a place.

#### **STEP 6**

Once you add the placemark- to the globe, click 'Edit place' to reveal a full menu of options to style your placemark, line or shape. You can edit the placemark icon, change its colour, size and altitude or edit the colour and width of lines and shapes.

#### **STEP 7**

Click the camera button to add an image or video to your places.

#### **STEP 8**

You can add information and links about your place with the rich text editor.

#### STEP 9

When you are happy you can preview your presentation by clicking the button at the top.

#### **STEP 10**

Set the point of view that your viewer will experience by dragging the camera position to where you want it and then click the 'Capture this view' button.

#### STEP 11

You can add a StreetView panorama as a new place in your project. Click the StreetView icon in the bottom right of your screen and it will show you all available imagery in the area that you are looking at as blue lines and dots.

#### STEP 12

Click on any blue dot or line and you will be taken inside that Street View photosphere. Click the 'Capture this view' button to give the photosphere a title and save it to your project.

#### **STEP 13**

Click on 'New feature' and add a 'Fullscreen slide' to create a title card introducing your project.

#### **STEP 14**

Add a title and tagline to your title card. You can use a background colour or add a background image.

#### **STEP 15**

Click on the 'Present" button to be taken on a narrative journey through your project. Reorder your places to change the narrative.

#### **STEP 16**

The three buttons at the top of the allow you to share, delete or export your project as a KML.

#### **STEP 17**

Clicking the share button produces a new window where you can invite people to collaborate, view or create a shareable link.
