Learning Intentions

By the end of this activity, students will:

- Be able to identify and discuss key themes from the video episode.
- Develop their ability to express opinions and listen actively to peers.
- Evaluate different perspectives on how technology impacts society.
- Collaborate effectively to present insights in a structured way.

Success Criteria

Students will demonstrate success by:

- Actively participating in discussions and sharing relevant viewpoints.
- Engaging in respectful debate, considering multiple perspectives.
- Summarising key discussion points clearly in a group presentation.
- Justifying opinions with examples from the video or external knowledge.

Activity Breakdown

Step 1: Pre-Discussion (10 minutes)

- Students watch the episode or a short recap.
- Teacher facilitates a Think-Pair-Share warm-up:
 - Think: Individually note down 3 key takeaways from the video.
 - Pair: Discuss with a partner and refine thoughts.
 - Share: Each pair contributes an insight to the class.

Step 2: Small Group Discussion (15-20 minutes)

- Groups of 3-5 students are assigned specific discussion prompts (adjust based on the episode's content). Example prompts:
 - a. What are the most important messages from the video? Why?
 - b. How does this topic relate to real-life situations or challenges?
 - c. Can you think of ethical dilemmas connected to the topic?
 - d. How might this subject evolve in the future?
 - e. How does it connect with other school subjects or learning?

- Each group assigns a role to ensure active engagement:
 - Facilitator: Keeps discussion on track.
 - Note-taker: Summarises key points.
 - Presenter: Shares findings with the class.
 - Timekeeper: Ensures discussion stays within limits.

Step 3: Group Presentations (10 minutes)

- Each group presents their key discussion points in a 1-2 minute summary.
- Teacher or class provides brief feedback.

Step 4: Reflection & Exit Ticket (5 minutes)

- Individual students write a short reflection answering:
 - What was one idea that changed or challenged your perspective?
 - How can you apply this discussion to your own life or studies?
- Alternatively, use a digital tool like Padlet for anonymous reflections.
