# Design Your Own Bealtaine May Bush

Students explore the Celtic tradition of the May Bush, part of Ireland's ancient Bealtaine festival marking the beginning of summer.

Through research and art, students create their own symbolic May Bush using natural or recycled materials.





#### **Learning Intentions:**

Understand the cultural and historical significance of Bealtaine in Irish heritage.

Explore how symbols and materials communicate meaning in art. Express personal and seasonal themes through creative design.
